## COGNITIVE EXCHANGE REPORT 2017-2018


#### Abstract

ABOUT COGNITIVE EXCHANGE: Cognitive Exchange is An Education non-profit organization based out of Folsom, California, USA. Cognitive Exchange started as new idea created by a group of students from Folsom, California with one objective in mind "To promote free and independent thinking to students around the world through speech and debate". The students from California are helping our students obtain important life skill beyond their basic academic curriculum. They are providing the students with the platform to discuss local and global issues. They are preparing them for their future. They aspire students gain the skill they need to become active participant in their community.


## LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

They help the students around the world (starting in India) develop advanced communication skills, confidence and promote free and independent thinking.

## WHAT IS THEIR PLAN?

Their plan is to spread this club into multiple areas through California. They want this program to be accessible to all schools and students who need it regardless of their location or financial situation.

## SELECTION PROCESS:

We had selected 4 to 5 students from different stream of the college. The Regional Coordinator from India Mr. Amit Deokule came to select students for first batch. The selection criteria comprises interview, on the spot speech on given topic and questions. Out of 25 students he selected 17 students for first module.


## ABOUT MODULES AND SESSIONS:

Cognitive Exchange program covers 4 Modules and each module comprises $8 / 9$ sessions. The students have to undergo each module and upon successful completion of the module they deemed eligible for the subsequent module. We at MIT Arts, Commerce and Science College started with first module from 9/9/2017, the first module comprise of 8 sessions and the session duration is typically an hour. All sessions were online and were conducted through Zoom software .First 4 sessions were arranged on every Saturday at 9.00 am and remaining 4 sessions on every Monday on same time (i.e. at 9.00 am ). Total 9 students were selected for the final competition which was held on 26/02/2018 ( $9^{\text {th }}$ week from day of commencement). The criteria for students qualifying for the competition were based on the overall performance of the student
and their attendance for the entire sessions. Out of the 9 students only 6 students had participated in the competition and Miss. Sayali Dabhade won the Gold Medal. The students were felicitated on the same day and they received the certifications by hands of Mr. Ami Deokule (Regional Coordinator), and Mrs. Kavita Shinde (Coordinator MIT ACSC).

## OUTCOME:

The course was designed in such a way that it helped the participants to learn and enhance their skills, the participants stage courage, and confidence level kept improving with each session, on the communication skills perspective ,they learned to build the speech with crisp and precise content, how to pace the speech, and put across the point to be conveyed, narrate it in front of larger audience, this has immensely helped them to learn and implement the skills which would definitely help them going forward in their respective career endeavors.
