
Objective- The **objective** of the sport is to catch the **ball** without allowing it to bounce on the ground and **throw** it back on to the opponent's side of the court.

“Report on Kabaddi Competition”

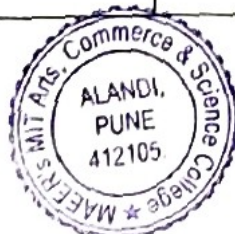


