Date: 1 August, 2017

Young Speakers Club organized a workshop on Nurture Self for Anganwadi Workers, Moshi and Dehu Session, Pune. The workshop was organized from 27 July to 31 July 2017 in the college campus.

Anganwadi Workers play a vital role in the children's development. They are role models for pre-school students. Generally the children from weaker sections join these Anganwadi. Anganwadi is a type of rural mother and child care centre in India. They were started by the Indian government in 1975 as part of the Integrated Child Development Services program to combat child hunger and malnutrition.

Anganwadi is a crucial project by Indian Government for the development of children. Considering the importance of Anganwadi workers in children's development, Young Speakers Club conducted workshop for the Anganwadi Workers. The aim of the workshop was to create awareness about their strengths and to motivate them for self-development. Four sessions on topics related to personal development were conducted.

## COGNITIVE EXCHANGE REPORT 2017-2018


#### Abstract

ABOUT COGNITIVE EXCHANGE: Cognitive Exchange is An Education non-profit organization based out of Folsom, California, USA. Cognitive Exchange started as new idea created by a group of students from Folsom, California with one objective in mind "To promote free and independent thinking to students around the world through speech and debate". The students from California are helping our students obtain important life skill beyond their basic academic curriculum. They are providing the students with the platform to discuss local and global issues. They are preparing them for their future. They aspire students gain the skill they need to become active participant in their community.


## LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

They help the students around the world (starting in India) develop advanced communication skills, confidence and promote free and independent thinking.

## WHAT IS THEIR PLAN?

Their plan is to spread this club into multiple areas through California. They want this program to be accessible to all schools and students who need it regardless of their location or financial situation.

## SELECTION PROCESS:

We had selected 4 to 5 students from different stream of the college. The Regional Coordinator from India Mr. Amit Deokule came to select students for first batch. The selection criteria comprises interview, on the spot speech on given topic and questions. Out of 25 students he selected 17 students for first module.


## ABOUT MODULES AND SESSIONS:

Cognitive Exchange program covers 4 Modules and each module comprises $8 / 9$ sessions. The students have to undergo each module and upon successful completion of the module they deemed eligible for the subsequent module. We at MIT Arts, Commerce and Science College started with first module from 9/9/2017, the first module comprise of 8 sessions and the session duration is typically an hour. All sessions were online and were conducted through Zoom software . First 4 sessions were arranged on every Saturday at 9.00 am and remaining 4 sessions on every Monday on same time (i.e. at 9.00 am ). Total 9 students were selected for the final competition which was held on 26/02/2018 ( $9^{\text {th }}$ week from day of commencement). The criteria for students qualifying for the competition were based on the overall performance of the student
and their attendance for the entire sessions. Out of the 9 students only 6 students had participated in the competition and Miss. Sayali Dabhade won the Gold Medal. The students were felicitated on the same day and they received the certifications by hands of Mr. Amit Deokule (Regional Coordinator), and Mrs. Kavita Shinde (Coordinator MIT ACSC).

## OUTCOME:

The course was designed in such a way that it helped the participants to learn and enhance their skills, the participants stage courage, and confidence level kept improving with each session, on the communication skills perspective ,they learned to build the speech with crisp and precise content, how to pace the speech, and put across the point to be conveyed, narrate it in front of larger audience , this has immensely helped them to learn and implement the skills which would definitely help them going forward in their respective career endeavors.

## 6.) DOMINO EFFECT

A domino show is created by standing up dominoes in sequence, to create a chain reaction also called the domino effect. Only the first domino should be toppled by hand. People all over the world try to set up incredible domino projects. One of the elements of excitement of a domino show comes from the risky nature. Everybody understands that every new set up domino is another new risk to lose all of the work they have just completed. The game is normally played in pairs (two against two) and is played as a series of "ends". In each "end", the objective is for players to attach a domino from their hand to one end of those already played so that the sum of the end dominoes is divisible by five or three.

Dominoes is a family of boardgames played with rectangular "domino" tiles. Each domino is a rectangular tile with a line dividing its face into two square ends. Each end is marked with a number of spots (also called pips, nips, or dobs) or is blank. The backs of the dominoes in a set are indistinguishable, either blank or having some common design. The domino gaming pieces (colloquially nicknamed bones, cards, tiles, tickets, stones, chips, or spinners) make up a domino set, sometimes called a deck or pack. The traditional Sino-European domino set consists of 28 dominoes, featuring all combinations of spot counts between zero and six. A domino set is a generic gaming device, similar to playing cards or dice, in that a variety of games can be played with a set.

## Objectives:-

The most popular type of play are layout games, which fall into two main categories, blocking games and scoring games.

- Most domino games are blocking games, i.e. the objective is to empty one's hand while blocking the opponent's. In the end, a score may be determined by counting the pips in the losing players' hands.
- In scoring games, the scoring is different and happens mostly during game play, making it the principal objective.


## Judging Criteria:

One way to determine seating amngements is by loc Atter the tiles ame shumfled, each player draws a domino from the stock. The glayer who draws the tile with the greatest number of pips has first choice of seats. The player bolding the zext highest sears himealf to the left, and so on. If there is a tie, it is broken by drawing rew doeinoes from the stok. The tiles are returned to the stock and reshuffled tefore the players draw their tands, When a parmenship game is played. the partners sit opposite each other

To make this game more interesting the garticipuns were provided with the following material.

3. Double side tape
4. Toothpicks
5. Plastic pipes
6. Deck cards
7. Marbles
8. Plastic balls

9. Ice-cream sticks
